Healthwatch Dudley Board meetings

Our Board meetings take place regularly and members of the public are welcome to observe. Agendas and minutes from previous meetings are available on our website or by request.

Listening and supporting

In the last three months we have had 52 indepth conversations with people who access health and care services either to support them with how to access services, help them understand how to complain or to simply be a listening ear to people who feel that systems and services are letting them down.

Some of our referrals have come via the Integrated Plus service. Four of our more complex conversations have resulted in home visits to people who have shared wide and varied experiences of mental health services, dentists, doctors and community services.

Conversations reflect the complexity of people's lives but the common theme between everyone we have spoken to indepth has been the relief of being able to talk to someone independent and to receive unbiased information in return.

Making a difference locally

Smoking survey

Healthwatch Dudley has been working with other Black Country local Healthwatch on a piece of research to better understand people's attitudes towards and experiences of quitting smoking.

During October and November we listened to the views of smokers, ex-smokers and nonsmokers. We conducted over 500 surveys, some of which were carried out in waiting areas of Russells Hall Hospital.

We also held three focus group sessions with children from Kates Hill Community Primary School, young people at CHADD and people who access services at Summit House Support. Findings are being collated and will be shared in our next guarterly report.

Our brilliant volunteers Sue and Nick are helping to enter our smoking attitudes surveys. Have you taken part yet?

Broadmeadow Coffee Morning -

Healthwatch Dudley organised a coffee morning to grow relationships with residents of Broadmeadow Extra Care housing complex. Residents talked about their health, mobility and social care and received information about local support and services. One of the issues raised involved concerns about unregistered opticians visiting residents and providing poor service.

Healthwatch Dudley identified an accredited opticians list from NHS England, which was shared with Dudley borough Extra Care housing scheme managers. Similar events are being held with Willowfields and Lime Gardens schemes.

Coombswood Surgery Listening Event

Healthwatch Dudley was asked by Dudley Clinical Commissioning Group to independently listen to and feed back on discussions between patients and staff from Coombswood Surgery.

A meeting took place in Halesowen in October to talk about how the practice and patients can better work together. During this meeting we recorded issues and ideas so that moving forward this could form a base for more positive relationships and experiences between patients and staff at the surgery.

A series of commitments were made by the practice to improve overall communication with patients, which Healthwatch Dudley will monitor.

Safeguarding Lay Person Interviews

Healthwatch Dudley was invited to bring together a group of people with different health and wellbeing experiences to support the interview process of a potential public representative on the Dudley Adult Safeguarding Board. More information will be shared about our engagement approach in our next report.

Multi-Speciality Community Provider (MCP)

Dudley Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) is working with partners to redesign health, social care and voluntary sector services across Dudley borough. A new way of working is being planned that will join up physical health, mental health, social care and voluntary sector services through the development of GP practice based teams.

Dudley CCG has listened to and taken on board feedback from our People's Network event and Activate sessions to help to shape what the MCP will look like.

A Healthwatch Dudley board member has a seat on the group that is developing the MCP as a community representative to help provide assurance that the process is transparent.

Our Priorities

In addition to our important day-to-day work, we have identified the following three priorities to concentrate on during 2016-18 to help us to listen to some of the least heard and most vulnerable people in Dudley borough.

- 1. Championing the voices of children, young people, families and carers to improve health and care outcomes.
- 2. Listening and responding to people with experience of mental ill health, to ensure their knowledge and expertise is used to improve access to and quality of local services.
- 3. Supporting our partners in health and care to involve local people as they transform care for patients.

Our proudest achievement - Dudley Deaf Focus Group

Deaf people have been telling us about the challenges they face when communicating with health professionals and we responded by bringing together a focus group to talk about these experiences in more detail.

During the last year we have been meeting bi-monthly with people from the deaf community, to share their views about health and wellbeing and some of the problems they face when accessing services. We have invited representatives from Dudley Group NHS Foundation Trust, who have been listening and responding to a wide range of issues that have been raised with the support of British Sign Language interpreters.

A common issue with group members was anxiety about missing their turn whilst waiting for appointments if they cannot hear their names being called and they are not otherwise alerted. During a group discussion, it was suggested that this could be avoided with the use of vibrating and flashing pagers, which could be given to hearing impaired patients on arrival.

The hospital listened and we have been advised that vibrating pagers are now on order and will soon be introduced to outpatients and the Emergency Department at Russells Hall Hospital. This positive feedback was shared with the Dudley CCG Patient Opportunity Panel who are keen to support the same initiative within GP surgeries.

Group members have also been involved with reviewing posters for display within the Trust. As a result of our meetings, the Trust are also exploring how more formal deaf awareness training can be delivered to their staff, to complement their existing awareness sessions.

Dudley Clinical Commissioning Group has been invited to help the group to understand more about what they do. This will provide Dudley Deaf Focus Group with even more opportunities to influence change.



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
